## INTRODUCTION

In the 1950s, the world of diving was forever changed with the introduction of the first purpose-built dive watches. These timepieces were not just accessories; they were critical tools that divers relied upon for their safety and timing underwater.

The 1956 Marine Automatic is a tribute to this transformative era, capturing the spirit of innovation and adventure that defined the golden age of dive watches.

## SPECIFICATIONS

Caliber:	Miyota 8215 Automatic
Power reserve:	42 Hours
Glass:	Double domed sapphire glass
Water Resistance:	20.ATM – Water tested to 200 meters. Suitable for diving



## **HOW TO SET TIME AND DATE**

1. Unscrew the crown counterclockwise and pull out to first click position.
2. Turn the crown counter clockwise to set the date.
  1. Pull the crown out to second click position.
  2. Turn the crown counterclockwise to set the time.
  3. Push the crown back into normal position.
4. Always securely screw in the crown.

You do so by pushing the crown towards the watch while screwing it clockwise until it's 100% tight.

**If this is not done correctly you risk that moist and dust will enter your watch!**

## **HOW TO WIND UP THE MAINSPRING**

1. Rotate the crown clockwise at normal position.
2. Wind turning the ratchet wheel screw 8 times. It will start to move naturally after shaking slightly.  
(with winding machine. Full wind up conditions  
rotary speed : 30 rpm Operating time : 60 minutes.)

## **ACCURACY**

1. Static Accuracy : -20~+40 seconds per day
